Files needed to delete [Volumes](#) from a defined list from nominated [Customer-ID](#) and [Media-ID](#) using [TMSS10VolumeDelete](#).

Examples

Delete Volumes From CSV List

Delete [Volumes](#) from TapeTrack from a CSV list, using set [Customer-ID](#) and [Media-ID](#) Files Required:

- CSV file of required [Volumes](#)
- Configuration file
- TTIDEF definition file

CSV File

CSV File **volumes.csv**

```
100011L4
100012L4
100023L4
100025L4
100026L4
```

TTIDEF File

TTIDEF File **default.ttidef**

Set CSV delimiter to comma, [Customer-ID](#) to US01, [Media-ID](#) to LTO and extract Barcode value from column one.

```
SetCSVDelimiter(",");

SetLiteral(CUSTOMER, "US04");
SetLiteral(MEDIA, "LTO");

Extract(BARCODE, 1, 8, 0);
```

Configuration File

Load Scanfile of [Volume-ID's](#), traverse input file.

If [Volume-ID](#) is present in the Scanfile delete [Volume](#), if not skip [Volume](#).

Configuration File **master.cfg**

Command Line Syntax

Delete all [Volumes](#) in volumes.csv from [Customer-ID](#) US01 and [Media-ID](#) LTO

```
TMSS10VolumeDelete -S user:-password@server -c master.cfg -l -r * <
volumes.csv
```
